



SFPA Park Policy Council FAQ

What is the Park Policy Council?

The Park Policy Council is a grassroots advisory body on policy and advocacy issues relating to parks and open space. The Council will provide the SFPA Executive Director, SFPA staff, and the Board of Directors grounded opinions on policy issues and advocacy priorities. The SFPA Board of Directors will ultimately decide positions on significant issues of citywide importance and long-term impact.

Who serves on the PPC?

The Council is made up of 2 volunteer representatives from each supervisorial district who are actively interested in parks and recreation issues, are well connected within their respective neighborhoods and are willing to contribute constructively.

What is the commitment?

Members serve one-year terms. Terms are renewable. Council meetings are held on the 2nd Wednesday of every month at various recreation centers in the city. Council members should expect to spend 10 hours per month reading materials, conducting research, attending public meetings/hearings and working in small groups.
